In addition to his Hoover appointment, Larry Diamond is a professor of political science and sociology, by courtesy, at Stanford University. His current research examines comparative trends in the quality and stability of democracy in developing countries and postcommunist states as well as U.S. foreign policy and nongovernmental activity to promote democracy abroad. A Hoover fellow since 1985, he has authored or edited twenty-six books, including *Developing Democracy: Toward Consolidation* (1999). Since 1990, he has been coeditor of the *Journal of Democracy* and codirector of the National Endowment for Democracy's International Forum for Democratic Studies, Washington, D.C. Since September 2001, he has served as a consultant to the U.S. Agency for International Development on new strategies for foreign assistance. He received his Ph.D. in sociology from Stanford University.
