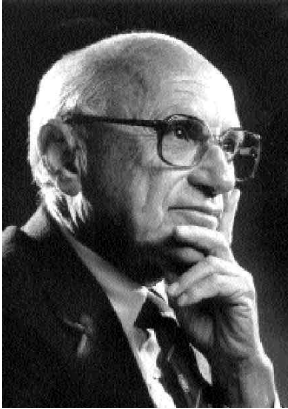


## MILTON FRIEDMAN

The winner of the 1976 Nobel Memorial Prize in economic sciences, Milton Friedman has been a Hoover fellow since 1977. He is also a professor emeritus of economics at the University of Chicago, where he taught from 1946 to 1976. Widely regarded as the leader of the Chicago school of monetary economics, he has also written extensively on public policy, with a primary emphasis on the preservation and extension of individual freedom. Among his many publications in this area are *Capitalism and Freedom* (1962), *Free to Choose* (1980), and *Tyranny of the Status Quo* (1984), all of which were written with Rose D. Friedman. Their most recent book is *Two Lucky People* (1998), their memoirs. He is a fellow of the American Philosophical Society, the National Academy of Sciences, and the Econometric Society. He was also awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom and the National Medal of Science.
