Appointed as a Hoover fellow in 2001, James Sweeney is a professor of management science and engineering at Stanford University, where he was appointed to the faculty in 1971. The holder of a Ph.D. in engineering-economic systems from Stanford, he served at Stanford as director of the Center for Economic Policy Research from 1984 to 1986, as chairman of the Institute for Energy Studies from 1981 to 1985, and as director of the Energy Modeling Forum from 1978 to 1984. He is the author of *The California Electricity Crisis* (2002).
