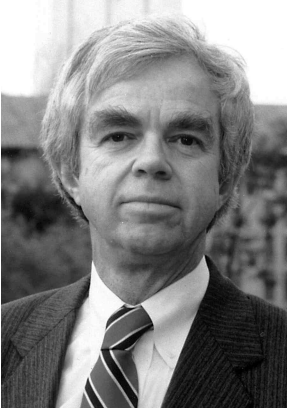

A Hoover fellow since 1971, Martin Anderson served as special assistant to former president Richard Nixon from 1969 to 1971 and as domestic and economic policy adviser to former president Ronald Reagan from 1981 to 1982. He also served as an adviser to the George W. Bush presidential campaign from 1998 to 2000. He is currently a member of the U.S. Defense Policy Board Advisory Committee. The author or editor of eight books, including *Revolution* (1988) and *Impostors in the Temple* (1992), his most recent is *Reagan, in His Own Hand* (2001), which he coedited with Hoover fellows Annelise Anderson and Kiron Skinner. A. Anderson, Skinner, and he are also coediting *Reagan: A Portrait in Letters*, which will be published in 2003. Anderson received his Ph.D. in industrial management from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.
