She has also served as managing editor of *Public Interest* magazine and executive editor of *National Interest*. Her most recent articles of note include "Why Ritalin Rules" and "Home-Along America" (*Policy Review*) and "Pedophilia Chic' Reconsidered," "Feminism's Children," and "The Elephant in the Sacristy" (*Weekly Standard*).
