In addition to his Hoover appointment, Thomas MaCurdy is an endowed professor in Stanford University's Department of Economics. His current research interests include Medicare expenditures, welfare dependency patterns among the young, low-wage labor markets, work disincentive effects of income taxation, the effects of unemployment insurance, Social Security, and government aid for health care. His most recent books include *Does California's Welfare Policy Explain the Slower Decline of Its Caseload?* (2002) and *Helping Working-Poor Families: Advantages of Wage-Based Tax Credits over the Earned Income Tax Credit and Minimum Wages* (2002). The holder of a Ph.D. in economics from the University of Chicago, he is a fellow of the Stanford Institute of Economic Policy Research, an adjunct fellow of the Public Policy Institute of California, and a research associate of the National Bureau of Economic Research.
