The holder of a law degree from the University of California, Berkeley, Edwin Meese served as U.S. attorney general from 1985 to 1988. From 1981 to 1985, he was counsellor to the president and, prior to that, chief of staff to Governor Ronald Reagan and professor of law at the University of San Diego. He published his memoirs, *With Reagan: The Inside Story*, in 1992. In addition to his Hoover appointment, he is a distinguished fellow and holder of the Ronald Reagan Chair in Public Policy at the Heritage Foundation and a distinguished senior fellow at the University of London's Institute of United States Studies. His current research focuses on the criminal justice system, federalism, homeland security, and terrorism.
