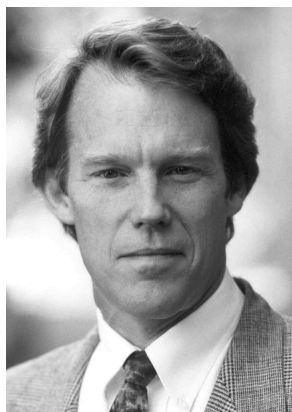

Terry Moe is a professor of political science at Stanford University as well as a senior fellow at Hoover. His current research is concerned with teacher unions, school choice, and the education system more generally. A major force in the choice movement, he has authored two influential books in this area: *Politics, Markets, and America's Schools* (1990), with John Chubb, and *Schools, Vouchers, and the American Public* (2001). He has also edited and contributed articles to two important volumes, *Private Vouchers* (1995) and *A Primer on America's Schools* (2001). Along with his work on education, he has written extensively on public bureaucracy and the presidency and is considered a leading figure in both fields. He is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.
