A Hoover fellow since 2000, Paul Peterson is a member of Hoover's Koret Task Force on K–12 Education. He also is an endowed professor in the Department of Government at Harvard University, where he directs the Program on Education Policy and Governance. The holder of a Ph.D. in political science from the University of Chicago, his current research interests include analyzing the effectiveness of school choice and accountability plans. The author or editor of more than twenty books, his most recent are, with William Howell, *The Education Gap* (2002); with coeditor David Campbell, *Charters, Vouchers and Public Education* (2002); with coeditors Morris Fiorina and D. Stephen Voss, *America's New Democracy* (2001); and, with coeditor Susan Mayer, *Earning and Learning: How Schools Matter* (1999). He is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and the National Academy of Education and a life member of the American Political Science Association.
