In addition to her Hoover appointment, Kiron Skinner is an assistant professor of history, political science, and public policy at Carnegie Mellon University, director of Carnegie Mellon's International Relations Program, and an adjunct fellow of the Council on Foreign Relations in New York City. She is also a member of the U.S. Defense Policy Board Advisory Committee and was recently appointed to the Dwight D. Eisenhower Memorial Commission. The holder of a Ph.D. in political science from Harvard University, she specializes in international relations with an emphasis on great power relations (the United States, Russia, and China). She is currently writing two books on U.S.-Soviet relations near the end of the cold war. She is also coediting *Reagan: A Portrait in Letters* with Hoover fellows Annelise Anderson and Martin Anderson, with whom she also coedited *Reagan, in His Own Hand* (2001).
