In addition to his Hoover appointment, Charles Wolf is a corporate fellow in international economics at the RAND Corporation and former dean of the RAND Graduate School. His current research concentrates on the economics of Asia and Europe and their effects on security and defense issues. In Europe, the work has focused on the European security and defense policy and its rapid reaction force. In Asia, his research addresses major challenges confronting China's economic development. The holder of a Ph.D. in economics from Harvard University, he has written numerous articles and books on economics, defense, and international affairs, including *Markets or Governments: Choosing between Imperfect Alternatives* (1993), *Asian Economic Trends and Their Security Implications* (2000), and *European Military Prospects, Economic Constraints, and the Rapid Reaction Force* (2001). A forthcoming book is entitled *Straddling Economics and Politics: Cross-Cutting Issues in Asia, the United States, and the Global Economy*.
